Answer: According to the IRS; non-profit organizations cannot purchase gift cards. The risk here is individual or member benefit, which is cause for the IRS to remove the non-profit status. Your members including teachers or individuals cannot benefit personally. The other problem is that when using gift cards, it is truly the same as giving cash. There is no itemized receipt for what was actually purchased with PTA funds. It is recommended to find other ways to show appreciation. In lieu of the gift cards, we would recommend directly purchasing items to hand out - flowers, food, books, classroom supplies, etc. We always want to find ways to
