Can our PTA purchase gift cards?

Answer: According to the IRS; non-profit organizations cannot purchase gift cards. The risk here is individual or member benefit, which is cause for the IRS to remove the non-profit status. Your members including teachers or individuals cannot benefit personally. The other problem is that when using gift cards, it is truly the same as giving cash. There is no itemized receipt for what was actually purchased with PTA funds.

It is recommended to find other ways to show appreciation.

In lieu of the gift cards, we would recommend directly purchasing items to hand out - flowers, food, books, classroom supplies, etc. We always want to find ways to support and show our appreciation for school faculty and staff, but we also do not want any PTA to jeopardize its non-profit status.

Another example to show Teacher Appreciation is that the PTA could provide volunteers to cover classrooms and then cater a luncheon in support of the teachers.

Nominating Committees

A Primer

It's time to read your bylaws! That's where you will find critical information about forming your PTA's nominating committee. Look for Article VI, Section 8, where it says how many people you will need (and how many alternates). That's step one in the nominating process.

Use the PTA Nominating Committee and [Elections Guide](#) on the state PTA site to navigate you through this process.

A diverse nominating committee means a diverse board, and with that comes a diversity of thought - new ideas that have a larger impact on your whole school population. Pick well-qualified people who know a good cross-section of your community. Please note that your current president may not serve on the nominating committee.

Once you have established your nominating committee,
